We have not resettled any child this month but hopefully in March we are likely to resettle some and others will be going for Fostering.

The children are very happy at school and use the Van to take them.

Mary , Annet and Dorothy are doing well too. We are doing well and the volunteers do a great job to help the children. Teacher Irene helps these young children who stay at the Home.

MEDICATION


