The Home has been in lockdown in December after the Christmas party due to some few Corona cases. Our Germany and Spanish volunteers got Covid and they were in Quarantine for 2 weeks until they tested Negative. Later 3 mothers also were affected but got treatment and are now healed.

The children were not affected and we thank God for that.

HOME STATUS

The Home is moving on well both the children and staff is fine but we have a few new children who are sick but improving steadily.

The Home is moving on well with 50 children 24 girls and 26 boys.


We got 2 new children in November and 2 in December. 2 girls and 2 boys

The boy is Mugisa Gift Byaruhanga born of the mentally sick mother who was sighted at a certain school where he was abandoned and left alone.

He was brought to the Home by the Probation officer and the area local council one for safety.

He was totally malnourished and anemic and was admitted in the Hospital for 2 weeks but now he is fine and eating very well.

Kagote is doing very well too. The plantation is doing well and we are harvesting maize, beans and some vegetables.


We harvest matooke every week and Tadeo is doing a great job.
