HOME STATUS

The Home is moving on well with 48 children 24 girls and 24 boys.

NEW CHILDREN

We have 3 new children and all of them are Siblings. We got twins Isingoma Joseph Simon and Nyakato Mary Gelinde who lost their mother at the time of birth because of over bleeding. They were 2 days old but looked very weak. These twins were following a one year and half girl Gorret Katusiime who could not stay in their home because the father is unable to take care of them. They are 9 siblings and the father is really unable to take care of them at the moment.

These twins were under weight and they fell sick the second they were admitted in the Home. They were in the hospital for 5 days and they were put on a special milk formula to boost their immunity.

There is a very big improvement now.

Murunga Stephen is also improving and was taken to Kampala hospitals to check his leg but there is much improvement and a lot of tests were done and his next appointment is in September 3rd.
